

Valle di Soie The map on the far left is of the regions of Trentino. Most are named for the river valleys that run through them. Agriculture (apples, vegetables and alli Giudicarie grapes for wine) is the primary product of the area. Tourism is one of its principal industries. The map on the near left shows the location of Trentino in red. Alta Valsuzara and that of its neighboring partnerprovince of Alto Adige in tan. The capitol of Trentino is the city of Trento.
